Legislative Report by Ray Collins

"On behalf of a grateful nation." This was once a statement at some point in every time-honored military funeral. The events of the last several years are its failure to provide adequate pay and allowances, proper quarters, medical care, and sufficient retirement benefits; one must wonder if the U. S. Military has been serving a grateful nation.

Many of the pieces of legislation which are being touted again this session of congress seems to be gaining votes toward enactment. Lawmakers in both Senate and House have recently reintroduced bills, S.1032 and HR.2102, to fund The Major Richard Starr Act. Even when or if the bills to fund the Act are passed, the injustice continues due to the antiquated practice of off-setting retirement payments and Veterans Administration Compensation if below twenty years service at retirement and less than fifty percent disability. The primary reason the Starr Act has not been funded is first and foremost, "COST."

The Caring For Survivors Act would raise the Dependency and Indemnity Compensation from 43% of a hundred percent disabled veterans Compensation to 55% or an increase of about 450 dollars a month. This Act would also allow more survivors who have cared for a disabled veteran to claim DIC. The current time the veteran must have been 100% disabled is ten years. The Caring for Survivors Act will reduce that time period to five years.

The House version of The Caring for Survivors Act is HR. 680 and the Senate version is S. 611.

He has presented aspects of his research at the conferences of the Society for Military History, Army Historians, and to multiple service groups. His current research focus is on the accurate restoration of the ACH-47A serial number 64-131149 "Easy Money." He currently sits as an appointed member to the Alabama State Board of Education's K-12 Course of Study, and is a member of the Southeast Alabama STEM Learning Ecosystem. 


